Drug Allergy is a common – potentially fatal – condition. The diagnosis and management of drug allergy can be a challenging task for the clinician. Despite drug allergy being a common clinical problem, teaching in this field is hard to come by.

Although immunological aspects will be covered in the seminar, the lectures are biased towards the practical (evidence-based) diagnosis and management of common drug allergies. Speakers are either national or international experts in the field of drug allergy.

The primary aims of the seminar are to provide:

- an introduction to the immunology of adverse drug reactions
- an understanding of the spectrum of common drug allergies
- an understanding of the clinical presentation of drug allergies
- evidence-based strategies for the diagnosis & treatment of common drug allergies
- a foundation for collaborative research and service development

The seminar is designed for those clinicians who are frequently challenged by patients who present with drug allergies. The seminar will be presented at a 'specialist level'. The seminar is therefore suitable for Specialist Doctors, Trainees and Nurses who work in the fields of Allergy & Immunology, Anaesthetics, Paediatrics, Internal Medicine, Dermatology, Dentistry and ENT medicine.
